Welcome to a new school year! This booklet is designed to help answer several of your questions and concerns as your child transitions into junior high. We realize this is a time of great change for you and your teen. It is our goal to help your teen progress academically, accept responsibility, build character, and challenge himself or herself while understanding the balance between academics and extracurricular activities. There may be some moments of growing pains throughout this two year process, but by working together we can help your child realize his or her fullest potential. Through this, your child can learn what a difference an education can make in life.

Many students will learn that junior high requires time-management skills, as well as making choices and accepting the consequences of those choices. Ultimately, your teen will need to make choices on his or her own, which is part of growing up and becoming more mature. Throughout the year it will be very important that we communicate and work as a team. Your child will need to accept responsibility for being part of that team.

We are excited to continue our PBIS program in the junior high, which focuses on improving our school's ability to teach and support expected positive behaviors for all students. It is a proactive and systematic approach for discipline issues in which data is collected and reviewed by a team. The emphasis is on developing responsibility and maintaining a safe environment where teachers can teach and students can learn.

We will also continue using the MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Support-formerly RTI) program to assist students in learning basic academic/study skills, as well as providing emotional support on an as-needed basis. Research-based tests given to individual students will be combined with teacher data to determine the appropriate intervention for your child. You will be contacted if it is determined that your child would benefit from an individualized school-based intervention.

As junior high teachers, our job is to prepare students for high school, which is a big task in a small time-frame of only two years. It is expected that your child will take responsibility for his or her own success. Thank you for taking the time to work with your child to help develop responsibility and positive choice-making. We look forward to having a positive impact on your child's education!

- Communication- Junior High teachers are available by email, classroom phone, and/or by note. All teachers are willing to discuss concerns throughout the year. Please contact an individual subject-area teacher with specific academic concerns. In junior high, the term "homeroom" is simply used as a way to group the students for scheduling, so contacting the subject area teacher would be the best place to start with any concerns regarding a specific class. - 3. Student/Parent/Teacher/ Conferences- In junior high, we welcome and recommend the student attend conferences and actively participate. To make the best use of your time, group conferences are held with all of the teachers at the same time. In order to set up an appointment for a conference, you will need to contact Terri Jones at 832-2261 ext. 2607 or tiones@vg302.org prior to the first day of conferences.
- 4. <u>Teacherease</u>-Teacherease allows you to monitor your child's grades just by logging onto the computer. This is a wonderful way for you to be involved in your child's academic progress. All junior high parents will have an access code, allowing them to monitor their child's academic performance. These are given to parents during the first quarter. Most grades are updated on Thursday for eligibility, so that would be the best night to check for recently updated scores. Please note\*\*\* It generally takes a few days for the teacher to grade homework/tests and then post grades.
- Google Classroom- Some junior high teachers post homework assignments and class information on Google Classroom. For remote learning, students will need to check daily for each JH class. Be sure to look at the stream and the assignment tab.
- 6. <u>Classroom Expectations-</u> Students are expected to be on time and prepared for each class by having pencils, pens, books, folders, completed homework, assignment notebooks, and **charged** Chromebooks. In addition to the student handbook, each teacher has classroom procedures and expectations. Please contact the subject area teacher if you need a copy of specific guidelines.

- 7. Tests & Quizzes- It is very important that your child takes time to study for all tests and quizzes. In most classes, tests are worth a higher percentage of the grade. Students who study for tests and quizzes, tend to do better on tests and have less anxiety about tests in class. For most classes, a test can be expected about every two weeks. Quizzes occur more frequently and are usually once per week. There will be announced and unannounced quizzes given periodically in all classes. Students at this level are expected to inform parents about tests, as well as prioritize their own time to study for tests. Several JH teachers use Quizlet, so be sure your child knows how to use Quizlet.
- 8. <u>Library Book Check out</u>- In junior high, students have more access to a variety of reading materials from classroom libraries, school libraries, and through the inter-library loan system. Please talk to your child about the types of reading selections that are allowed in your house. Encourage your child to communicate with you about the content of the books being read.
- 9. <u>Grades/GPA/Honors Night</u>- An individual student's grade point average is figured each quarter. Students are recognized for High Honor Roll and Honor Roll. Students who maintain honor roll and/or high honor roll all year will be recognized at the Junior High Honors Night.
- 10. <u>Schedule/Changing Classes/Being on time</u> Students will change classes each period. They have **four** minutes to get to the next class. During this time, students are expected to get books for the next class as well as use the restroom and get a drink if needed. All students are expected to be in their seats by the time the bell **starts to ring**. Students who are not in their seats will be considered tardy. Tardies will accumulate and students who are tardy will receive consequences. Make a choice to be on time.
- 11. Hall passes/Assignment notebooks- Students will need to have a signed hall pass (in their assignment notebook) when in the hallway during class hours.
- 12. <u>Activity Period- Band/Choir/MTSS/Skills Groups</u>- Each student will have an individualized weekly schedule for activity period. During activity period, students are grouped by Band, Choir, MTSS, and other skill groups (Reading, Math, Current Events, Social/Emotional, and Study Skills. Schedules will be based on individual student MAPS scores and various other junior high school-wide interventions.
- 13. 7th and 8th P.E./Health- P.E. is for three quarters and Health is one quarter. During PE, a school uniform must be worn to participate. Students who choose to dress, actively participate, and demonstrate cooperation will do well in P.E. If a student chooses not to dress three times during one quarter, the student will not pass P.E. for that quarter. Students will have a combination lock for PE. P.E. lockers should remain locked at all times and the combination should not be shared. Generally, during P.E. there is not much homework, but there are written tests. During Health, homework is assigned 3-4 times per week. Please expect an increase in the amount of homework your child brings home during the quarter he or she is assigned to Health class.
- 14. JH Activities/Sports- We encourage all of our students to get involved in the available school-sponsored activities: Girls Basketball, Boys Basketball, Basketball Cheerleading, Competitive Dance, Track, Cross Country, Girls Volleyball, Girls Softball, Boys Baseball, Band, Choir, Spelling Bee, Student Council, and Red Ribbon Week. In addition, other opportunities are available to students through the local JFL and Summer Recreation programs.
- 15. Sports eligibility/physical-Students must maintain a passing average of at least 60% in all classes each week in order to be eligible to participate in school-sponsored sports. Grades are checked each week on Thursday for the upcoming week, which is Sunday-Saturday. If a student is ineligible three times

- during one sport, he or she will no longer be on the team. Students must have a sports physical on file before practicing in any sport. Physicals are good for one calendar year. In addition to the student handbook rules, the sports training rules are also in effect for students choosing to participate.
- 16. Student Council- Three students from each homeroom will be selected by their peers. Elections are held during the first quarter. Only students who have at least a "C" average in all classes throughout the year will be allowed to participate in Student Council. Student Council sponsors dances, field trips, special dress up days, and other fun activities.
- 17. <u>Junior High Dances & Special Events –</u> Our Junior High Student Council works very hard to create dances and other special events that are supervised social events for your child. In order to attend these events, students must "qualify" by completing work in the classroom and behaving appropriately at school. Students will be notified if they have not earned the privilege of attending these special events. School dances are reserved for junior high students enrolled at VGJH. For school dances, students must stay at the dance for the entire dance unless they are picked up early by their <u>own</u> parent(s). Upon leaving the dance, all students must sign-out and personally check-out with dance supervisors.
- 18. <u>Lunch-</u> At lunch students are welcome to purchase a la carte, hot lunch, or bring a lunch from home. Students are expected to keep track of their own student id code.
- 19. Lockers- Each student in junior high will have a hall locker. Students are expected to keep it organized. If your child is having difficulty with organization, please encourage him or her to stay after school to clean out his or her locker. In addition, there is only so much space in the locker; therefore, it needs to be cleaned often. The lockers do not lock, so honesty is appreciated. Slamming lockers, kicking lockers, and/or sharing lockers is not allowed. NO GUM, CANDY, OPEN FOOD, OR OPEN DRINKS ALLOWED IN LOCKERS.
- 20. <u>Dress code-</u>Students are expected to follow the school dress code listed in the handbook.
- 21. Cell phones-During the school day, cell phones must be turned off and in lockers at all times.
- 22. Chromebooks- 7th and 8th grade students are expected to care for their Chromebook by keeping it in the school-issued case and charging it each night. Chromebooks are to be used for **academic purposes only.** JH students are not to use headphones/earbuds unless directed by a teacher. Computer games are not to be played at all on Chromebooks (including between classes, lunch, and at home). Chromebooks should not be used in the cafeteria or on recess during the lunch hour.
- 23. Absences/ How to get homework for an absent student
  - Homework from an absence is a student-responsibility. Students should follow the individual classroom teacher's guidelines to obtain homework from an absence.
  - o If a parent/sibling is picking up homework, the parent must call the main office by 9:00 a.m. When calling, please let the office staff know that homework will need to be collected for the student for all of part of the day. Parents can pick up the homework in the main office. Please note: the office closes at 4:00 p.m.
- 24. Appointments/Returning to school during the day- If a student needs to leave early for an appointment, the student will need to notify the office between 8:00-8:15 a.m. The office will then issue the student an exit pass for the class period in which he or she needs to leave. All students must sign out in the office prior to leaving. All students must sign in upon returning during the school day.
